

# Callum and Maddie are rewarded for hard work

TWO Derby College art and design students have won bursaries from Derby Decorative and Fine Arts Society to support their move into higher education.

Art foundation diploma students Callum Dowling and Maddie Raithby have won £400 and £200 after being shortlisted for the annual Bryan Harris Bursary award, named after the society's founder and former chairman who died last year.

Callum, 19, of Allestree impressed judges with his abstract

graphics depicting architectural gems in Derby city centre photographed from unseen angles.

Callum has been offered a place to study a bachelor of arts degree in graphic design at the University of the Arts London and will use the bursary towards materials for his degree programme.

Runner-up Maddie Raithby, 19, of West Hallam created a garden model illustrating a vision of the future when humanity lives in harmony with nature. She plans to study a bachelor of science degree

in horticultural garden design at Nottingham Trent University and will use her bursary to buy research books.
